All clothing including accessories such as hats and gloves can be donated. Please monitor the quality of clothing. Pairs of gloves and such count as one item.

Find your local homeless shelters and coordinate with them regarding drop-offs. Be sure to understand what kind of clothing they are looking for. Please post on Instagram throughout your drop-off to earn points and don't go more than once per week.
